<p>What?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What are the key events? • What are the patterns or repetitions in the text? • What is the relationship between this text and those immediately before and after it? • What religious or social customs are evident in the text? • What evidence is there of the cultural context of the writing? • What persuasive language is used? • What stereotypes does the passage perpetuate, challenge? 	<p>Who?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Who are the characters? • How are they described, portrayed? • What titles are given to Jesus? • Do the characters have formal roles? • From what social groups do characters come? • How do characters interact? • What feelings are present in or absent from characters? • Which characters speak? To whom? • What do they say? Who remains silent? • What changes take place in characters? • Do characters behave as anticipated?
<p>When?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • When does the account take place? • time of the day? • day of the week? • in relation to other texts? • in relation to the entire Gospel? 	<p>How?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • How is the text written? • From whose perspective is the text written? • Whose position does it advocate?
<p>Where?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Where does the account take place? • geographically? • physically? 	<p>Why?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Why might the author have included this text? • What might they have hoped to convey? • Why did they place it here? • What questions did this text raise?

Questioning the Text:

<p>Clarify the Meaning</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ⇒ What does..... mean by that? ⇒ What is the main point? ⇒ What is an example of the issue? ⇒ How does..... relate to.....? ⇒ How could you summarise this passage? 	<p>Probing Assumptions</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ⇒ What is the author assuming? ⇒ What could we assume instead? ⇒ Is this assumption always the case? ⇒ Why is the reasoning based on.....? ⇒ What is the reasoning based on.....?
<p>Identifying Reasons</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ⇒ What reasons does the author give or imply? ⇒ Are those reasons adequate? ⇒ Is there any reason to doubt the reasons given? ⇒ What other information do we need to know? ⇒ What would convince you of the opposite view? 	<p>Establishing Viewpoint/Perspective</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ⇒ Why choose this perspective rather than another? ⇒ Could anyone view this text in another way? How? Why? ⇒ What would someone who disagrees say? ⇒ What is an alternative to this viewpoint? ⇒ How would you answer the objection that.....would make?
<p>Assessing Implications or Consequences</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ⇒ What is the author implying? ⇒ If this happened, what else would happen as a result? ⇒ What effect would that have on.....? ⇒ Would that necessarily happen, or probably happen? ⇒ If this is the case, what else must also be true?
