

## Questioning Strategy

**Purpose:** Provides a means by which students can show a summary of their learning. This gives the opportunity for the students to write some of the questions they have had throughout an inquiry topic and note down what these questions helped them understand.

**Description:** Students are to write down questions they have during the course of an inquiry topic and once they have adequately answered them, either through research, working with peers or consulting with the teacher, will write down their understandings.

**Process:**

- This task can be completed throughout an inquiry topic to show learning. It can also be used to provide teachers with a means by which to gauge learning and even direct future inquiry questions.
- Students write down any questions they may have, at any time, about the content of an inquiry topic.
- Students identify a way of having these questions answered and if they can be answered immediately or throughout the course of the topic.
- Students write the questions down.
- When the students feel their question has been answered they note down what the question helped them understand with regard to the inquiry or more generally.
